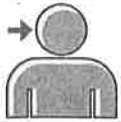

1. Latin root for *head*. The **captain** runs the ship. Washington, D.C., is the **capital** of the United States. The **capstone** is the stone at the top of a wall or other building. To **decapitate** is to remove the head.

2. Latin root for *health*. **Sanitation** crews pick up trash to keep the streets clean and the town healthy. Mentally healthy people are **sane**. People with severe mental illness are said to be **insane**. The sneeze-guard shield at a salad bar keeps the food **sanitary**.

3. Greek root for *love*. **Philanthropists** show their love for humanity by supporting charities and other good works. A **philosopher** is someone who seeks or loves wisdom. People who attend **philharmonic** performances appreciate good music.

4. Latin root for *row* or *rank*. The **order** of events take place one after another. **Ordinal** numbers show rank: first, second, third, and so on. **Ordinary** means not special, or of no special rank. Something extra-special, out of the ordinary, is **extraordinary**.

5. Latin root for *short*. An **abbreviation** is a short form of a longer word. A **breve** is the curved symbol for a short-vowel sound. The saying "**Brevity** is the soul of wit" means that to be clever, one should use only a few well-chosen words.


